

Description of Abstract Nouns

Nouns are words that name people, places or things. Most nouns can be detected with your senses. Nouns that you can touch, see, taste, hear or smell are called concrete nouns.

Some examples of concrete nouns:

computer tablet

Mrs. Thomas butterfly

Washington library

school bottle

Jane juice

Professor Smith Virginia

Abstract Nouns

Many other nouns can't be detected with your senses, such as the word happiness. Happiness is a thing, but you can't touch, see, hear, taste or smell it. Nouns that you can not identify with your senses are called abstract nouns. Abstract nouns name an idea or concept - things you think about or feel.

Abstract nouns are words that name something you can't see, touch, hear, taste or smell.

It can be a feeling, concept, experience, or idea.
