



Plural Nouns

Plural nouns name more than one person, place or thing. Irregular plural nouns are not formed by adding "-s" or "-es" to the end of the noun. Irregular plural nouns change form when you make them plural.

Nouns that end in "-f" are changed to "-ves" when there is more than one. For example, knife becomes knives when there is more than one.

Singular Noun	Plural Irregular Noun
elf	elves
calf	calves
shelf	shelves
loaf	loaves
wolf	wolves

Other nouns change form completely when there is more than one. For example, child becomes children when we make it plural. Here's some more examples of irregular plural nouns:

Singular Noun	Plural Irregular Noun
man	men
foot	feet
person	people
goose	geese
ox	oxen
cactus	cacti
octopus	octopi
appendix	appendices
tooth	teeth
mouse	mice

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
