

A noun names a person, place or thing (including an idea).

Singular nouns name one person, place, thing or idea.

teacher school cup man

## Possessive nouns show who or what owns something.

Singular possessive nouns are formed by adding an apostrophe and then an *S*.

Mark's teacher

Olivia's school

Diego's ball

man's coat

Plural nouns name more than one person, place, thing or idea.

teachers cups schools men

Plural nouns are usually made possessive by adding an apostrophe **after** the *S*.

teacher's cup's school's man's

When a plural noun does not end with an 5, an apostrophe and then an 5 are added.

The men's truck was dirty.
