

Contractions

A contraction is a shortened form of two or more words, usually using an apostrophe for the missing letters.

Some of the most common contractions include:

isn't (is not)	I'm (I am)	I've (I have)
can't (can not)	she's (she is)	she's (she has)
won't (will not)	he's (he is)	he's (he has)
don't (do not)	you're (you are)	you've (you have)
aren't (are not)	we're (we are)	we've (we have)
shouldn't (should not)	they're (they are)	they've (they have)
couldn't (could not)	why's (why is)	I'll (I will)
wouldn't (would not)	who's (who is)	she'll (she will)
haven't (have not)	there's (there is)	he'll (he will)
wasn't (was not)	that's (that is)	you'll (you will)
weren't (were not)	what's (what is)	we'll (we will)
hasn't (has not)	where's (where is)	they'll (they will)
hadn't (had not)	they'd (they would)	how'll (how will)
mustn't (must not)	she'd (she would)	who'll (who will)
