

Contractions

A contraction is a shortened form of two or more words, usually using an apostrophe for the missing letters. In the first example below, the missing "n" and "o" are replaced with an apostrophe.

She <u>can not</u> go to the store.

She <u>can't</u> go to the store.

Some more examples of contractions include:

We have not found our dog.

We haven't found our dog.

<u>I</u> am going to the dentist tomorrow afternoon.

<u>I'm</u> going to the dentist tomorrow afternoon.

<u>She is</u> asking a lot of questions about Santa.

<u>She's</u> asking a lot of questions about Santa.
