A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought, asks a question, or issues a command. A sentence usually contains a subject and predicate (verb).

Sentences should tell you both who (or what) did something, and what they did. All sentences end with punctuation (period, exclamation point or question mark). Sentences must express a complete thought, or they are not sentences.
