A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought, asks a question, or issues a command. A sentence usually contains a subject and predicate (verb).

Sentences should tell you both who (or what) did something, and what they did. The sentences are missing a predicate (what the subject did). For each sentence, pick a predicate to complete the sentence.
