

A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought, asks a question, or issues a command. A sentence usually contains a subject and predicate (verb).

Sentences should tell you both who (or what) did something, and what they did. Make a complete sentence by picking a subject (who or what), a prepositional phrase and a predicate (what they did). Write three sentences.

Subject (Who or What)	Predicate (What they did)	Prepositional phrase
A huge buffalo	scratched his back	in the last seconds.
The large elephant	grazed	down the hill.
My best friend	ran	in my room.
The big grizzly bear	won the game	on the tree.
My brother	made a mess	by our car.
