

A simple sentence has one independent clause, or one group of words that can stand alone and expresses a complete thought. A simple sentence can have a compound subject or predicate. Example: The dog and cat slept soundly on the rug. We skipped and ran through the fields.

Combine the two subjects (using a conjunction) to make a compound subject in each simple sentence.

- Jane liked mathematics. Mary liked mathematics.
- 2. The blue truck raced around the track. The yellow truck raced around the track.
- 3. The pillows do not look good in this room. The couch does not look good in this room.
- 4. Zucchini is good for you. Broccoli is good for you.
- 5. I won an award. My sister won an award.
