

Multiplication by 10, 100 and 1000


If we multiply any number by 10 it means, we have to add **one zero** at the end of that number

If we multiply any number by 100 it means, we have to add **two zero** at the end of that number

If we multiply any number by 1000 it means, we have to add **three zero** at the end of that number


Example 1:

Multiplying with 10

$$54 \times 10 = 540$$


Example 2:

Multiplying with 100

$$54 \times 100 = 5400$$


Example 3:

Multiplying with 1000

$$54 \times 1000 = 54000$$
