

TIME

(Reading the time: A.M. & P.M.)

A.M.

A.M. - ante meridiem , before noon

A.M. is the time starting from 12:00 midnight until 11:59 just before noon.

We use **A.M.** after the time in the morning.

The following times are all in the morning.

1:00 am, 8:00 am, 5:30 am, 11:40 am

For example:

1. I woke up at 6:00 **A.M.** in the morning.
2. Our exam started at 9:30 **A.M.** sharp.
3. Me and dad go for a walk at 6:00 **A.M.** before I go to school.
4. Today I saw the sunrise with my sister at 5:00 **A.M.**

P.M.

P.M. - post meridiem , after noon

P.M. is the time starting from 12:00 noon until 11:59 just before midnight.

We use **P.M.** after the time in the afternoon or in the evening.

The following times are all in the morning.

6:30 pm, 2:15 pm, 7:00 pm, 10:35 pm

For example:

1. Me and Sam usually go to bed at 8:00 **A.M.** after finishing our school work.
2. We went for shopping at 3:30 **P.M.** in the afternoon.
3. we came back from picnic very late at night. It was almost 11:50 **P.M.**
