Word	Meaning	Examples
smog (noun)	smoke that combines with pollution to create a fog	"The thick, grey smog hung in the air.", "Smog settled around the buildings."
tailpipe: (noun)	part of a car where the exhaust is expelled	"The tailpipe fell off the car.", "Thick exhaust poured out of the tailpipe."
vulnerable (adjective)	needing extra protection due to weakness or illness	"The cold made me vulnerable.", "The camp was vulnerable to attack by enemies."
hazardous (adjective)	when something is unsafe or puts you in danger	"Skydiving is hazardous.", "Playing with guns is hazardous."
fuels (noun)	something that creates energy like gas or coal	"Fossil fuels are used to create gasoline.", "Fuels go up and down in price."
