A tornado may be a natural weather event, but that does not make it less scary or volatile. During the tornado, a single gust of wind can reach 100 mph or more. Hail may pelt people, cars, and homes creating a deafening sound that is hard to ignore. In some places, **residents** have a choice to stay or go, but others require evacuation. Imagine having

only moments to grab necessities and get out of a house. Those that have to do it often are **inured** of the sirens and warnings, but also know what to expect. The acoustic of the sirens and the tornado are unimaginable unless you have been in the situation.

After such an event inflicting such substantial damage to property, people, and nature, it can take weeks or months to get things back to normal. Many people live with perturbation over potential weather events that can unleash chaos on their lives. It can be odd to see photos in which one house is flattened and the one adjacent is left almost untouched. How would you feel knowing it was common in your area to have weather that **ripped** through houses and could hurl a vehicle like it was a leaf?

The good news is you can prepare for such events by having several days' worth of food and fresh water for the people and pets in your house. Have a safety plan in place to make sure everyone knows what is happening if the family is not together. You can also go the extra step and buy a generator for electricity if the power is out. Infrasound generators are basically silent, but expensive. Also keep all important numbers handy in case settlements from insurance is necessary in the aftermath. Weather is natural, but it can be unpredictable.
