Planning Ahead

Some areas are prone to **drought**. This means there is a **scarcity** of water, one of the basic needs for all forms of life. If this is something that happens often, there are ways to plan ahead and not be as affected by a shortage. This starts at the governmental level with **municipal policies** that allow homeowners to make changes to their land to deal with water shortage.

Once approved, a homeowner can do things like dig irrigation ditches. These ditches route rain water to the areas that need them most, like a garden. Another option is to create a reservoir by digging a spot and creating dams so the water does not leak out. This can be a huge undertaking, but well worth it. The reason it is so difficult is because of the work involved, but also gauging how much water can be stored and what could be needed. The feasibility of such a large amount of work is not always work it. Some people may be lucky and can use extraction as a way to access groundwater, like with a manual pump or well. Groundwater often flows even in times of drought. This can offer relief when stricken with a period of light or erratic rain. This makes it possible to prolong the amount of time both land and people can last without rain falling.

Being prepared, when possible, is the best option.

Some people do not think this far ahead and run into problems when a **drought** does hit. It is always best to know what the normal weather is like in an area before settling.
