Word	Meaning	Examples
premiere (noun)	the first showing of a movie or first performance of a theatrical work	"headed to the movie premiere"; "movie premiere this weekend"
reel (noun)	a part of a movie	"in the final reel"; "a bloopers reel"
soundtrack (noun)	musical accompaniment to a movie, usually prerecorded	"the wonderful soundtrack"; "an uplifting soundtrack"
blooper (noun)	an embarrassing error often used to create a laugh	"a blooper reel"; "he laughed at the blooper"
choreographer (noun)	someone who composes steps and moves for a performance of a dance in theater or film	"a popular choreographer"; "ask the choreographer"

Word	Meaning	Examples
genres (noun)	a category of artistic composition defined by similar form, style, or subject	"my favorite genres"; "many musical genres exist"
cast (noun)	a character of something, a collection of actors	"the entire cast"; "a large cast"
thriller (noun)	a movie, novel, or play with an exciting plot, often involving crime or espionage	"the season's best thriller"; "a thriller series"
relic (noun)	an object surviving from an earlier time, often of historical or sentimental interest; antique; heirloom	"the movie was a relic"; "the actual relic was filmed for the movie"
evoke (verb)	bring to the conscious mind; elicit	"will evoke strong feelings"; "evoke a memory"

Word	Meaning	Examples
grossing (verb)	earn an amount of money as income or gross profit	"grossing a million dollars"; "grossing less than expected"
replicate (verb)	repeat	"hope to replicate the feelings"; "replicate the film"
showcase (verb)	to display or exhibit	"showcase the new choreography"; "showcase the new character"
concession (adjective)	snacks, food; a snack bar	"a concession stand"; "selling concessions at the theater"
turnout (noun)	number of people attending an event	"low turnout for the film"; "a massive turnout"
